



Genesis 11 = The TOWER Of Babel



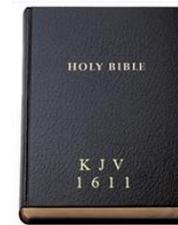

- *Nimrod* = Heb. *dwrmmn* (Nimrod) which could be derived from either the word *rmn* (Namer) meaning “leopard” or *drm* (Marad) meaning, “rebel”.
- Nimrod is the **13th** from Adam and 13 is the number of REBELLION cf. (14:4; 13:13; Rev 13)
- “Now it was Nimrod who excited them to such an affront and contempt of God. He was the grandson of Ham, the son of Noah—a bold man, and of great strength of hand. He persuaded them not to ascribe it to God, as if it were through his means they were happy, but to believe that it was their own courage which procured that happiness. He also gradually changed the government into tyranny—seeing no other way of turning men from the fear of God, but to bring them into a constant dependence upon his own power. He also said he would be revenged on God, if he should have a mind to drown the world again; for that he would build a tower too high for the waters to be able to reach! and that he would avenge himself on God for destroying their forefathers!”

In the *Epic of Gilgamesh*, it is clear from the description of Gilgamesh that he is none other than NIMROD.

- He was the man to whom all things were known
- He was wise, saw mysteries, and knew secret things
- He was created with a perfect body and was 1/3 man, 2/3 god
- He was the king of Uruk (i.e.- Erech) (v.10)
- He built a temple to Anu (the god of the firmament) and Ishtar (the goddess of fertility) at Uruk
- He was the greatest hero and strongest man in the world, and of all time
- He sought to vanquish Huwawa (Yahweh?), the sender of the Flood, so man would be rid of him and his evil forever
